

Orientation Programme on Survival and Development of Girl Child

Dates: 27- 31 May, 2013
Venue: NIPCCD, New Delhi

Programme Design

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) defines a child as a human being below the age of 18 years unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. India is home to about 43 crore children of which about 16 crore are in the age group of 0-6 years and about 27 crore are in the age group 6-18 years. Although the Constitution of India offers all citizens, including children, certain basic fundamental rights such as the right to life and liberty, right to equality, right to freedom of speech and expression, right against exploitation, right to freedom of religion and the right to constitutional remedies for the enforcement of fundamental rights but the situation of children, particularly girls in India is far from satisfactory.

As per Census 2011(provisional), the Sex Ratio in India is 940 females per every 1,000 males. Also, the child sex ratio (0-6 years) has further declined to 914 as compared to 927 in 2001. The worst affected States/ UTs in terms of Child Sex Ratio includes Haryana (830) , Punjab (846) , Jammu and Kashmir (859), Chandigarh (867), Delhi (866), ,Maharashtra(883) ,Rajasthan(883) , Gujarat(886) and Uttar Pradesh (899) . The data not only indicates that female foeticide and infanticide remain rampant in our society but also draws attention to bias against the girl child which begins early in life or even before birth and deprives her of equal opportunities for survival and development. The persisting gender inequalities, existing cultural beliefs and practices permeates into almost every aspect of the growing girl's, social and cultural environment and hampers her development throughout the life cycle. She has lesser entitlement to active participation, quality education, nutrition, basic sexual and reproductive health care and protection from any form of violence, abuse and exploitation. Their survival, development, well-being, protection and their participation as members of society are thus officially recognized as a matter of serious National concern.

India is a signatory to a number of International Instruments such as UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, with its Optional Protocols, and Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), thereby affirming its commitment to the growth and development of women and children. It has also accepted the International Commitments of the 'World fit for Children' adopted by the UN General Assembly Special Session on Children in 2002, and the Beijing Platform for Action for the Advancement of Women and Girls adopted by the World Conference on Women in 1995. The wholistic development of children is also integral to the Five Year Plans and the various law, policies and programmes of the Country.

The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme is a centrally sponsored flagship Scheme of the Government of India, which has been in operation since 1975 and aimed at addressing the health, nutrition and development needs of young children, pregnant and nursing mothers. The Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), being the nodal agency for women and children works in a wholistic manner to protect the rights and address the concerns of women and children. It has also initiated a new comprehensive scheme, Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls- SABLA in the year 2010 by merging the erstwhile Kishori Shakti Yojna and Nutrition Program for Adolescent Girls. The Scheme is primarily for out of school adolescent girls (11-18 years) and aims at empowering adolescent girls by improving their nutritional and health status and upgrading various skills like home skills, life skills and vocational skills etc. so that they have greater control over their life, grow up to be healthier, more confident and empowered women, equipped to make informed choices as well as take decisions on their own.

In addition, the Ministry introduced the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (2009-10) based on the cardinal principles of 'protection of child rights' and 'best interest of the child'. It is a centrally sponsored scheme aimed at building a protective environment for children in difficult circumstances, as well as other vulnerable children, through Government-Civil Society Partnership.

However, despite of the various initiatives, both on the legal and policy and programme level, it is realized that the condition of girl child remains a cause of concern in the Country. Further, it is accepted that the Government and Voluntary Organizations can together play a vital role in realizing the rights of the girl child, providing equal opportunities and improving their status in the society. The care and focus given to a girl, as a child and as an adolescent with focus on her survival, development, health, nutrition, education, protection, participation and economic potential will determine her empowerment as a woman and enable her to contribute positively to the society. Hence, there is an imperative need for sensitization regarding the importance of the girl child to reinforce the view that she is an asset and not a burden on the family. Keeping this in view the Institute proposes to organize an **Orientation Training on Survival and Development of Girl Child at its Headquarters at New Delhi from 27-31, May 2013.**

Objectives:

The main objectives of the training are to:

- i. orient the participants about status of children, especially girl child in India;
- ii. sensitize the participants about survival and development threats for girl child, declining sex ratio, female foeticide, girl child abuse/violence, child marriage and other social evil practices and its prevention;
- iii. make participants aware about gender equality at early childhood and positive image of the girl child;
- iv. familiarize the participants with various Government policies, rights, legislations and schemes related to survival, protection and development of girl child; and
- v. impart knowledge and skills for evolving effective strategies for survival and development of the girl child

Contents:

The training contents would broadly cover: health and nutritional status of girl child, causes and consequences of gender discrimination at early childhood and remedial measures, prevention of sex determination, child marriage, prevention measures on violence/abuse of girl child, child trafficking, life skills for adolescent girls, communication strategy for survival and development, child rights, legislations, policies and programmes for girl child etc.

Training Methodology

The participants will be provided conducive learning environment and participatory approach will be adopted during the training programme. Various training techniques like lecture-cum-discussion, group discussion, group exercise, would be used. Besides the faculty of the Institute, resource faculty will be drawn from government, non-governmental organizations, academic and technical institutions with relevant expertise in the subject matter and experience. Active participation of trainees and sharing of experiences would serve as a valuable resource enriching the learning process. The study material comprising background reading material, handouts, and exercise formats will be provided to the participants.

Participants

There will be 30-35 participants from all over the Country, comprising middle level officials of government/non-governmental organizations (NGOs), representatives of academic and technical institutions associated with planning and implementation of the schemes relating to the welfare and development of girl child.

Travel, Board and Lodging:

The representative from voluntary agencies will be reimbursed travel grant up to AC III tier rail fare or ordinary bus fare by the shortest route to and from the venue of the programme (fare of Rajdhani, Shatabdi, Duronto Express including tatkal and AC bus is **not permissible**). The journey by road to the nearest railway/bus station will be paid to the non-official participants on the basis of actual expenditure subject to ceiling of Rs.300/- each way. Local participants will be paid actual expenditure incurred on local conveyance subject to a limit of Rs.100/- each way per day. Officials deputed from government departments, will draw their TA/DA from their respective departments. However, the Institute will provide free board and lodging facilities to all the participants for the entire duration of the training.

Registration Fee:

While the Institute will continue to subsidize its programmes, it has been decided to charge a nominal registration fee of Rupees Five Hundred (Rs. 500/-) **only from NGOs**, per participant for entire duration of the training programme at the time of registration. A **non refundable processing fee of Rs.50/-** may be enclosed with the nomination proforma (without which nomination will not be accepted) in the form of Demand Draft in favour of "**Director, NIPCCD**", Payable at New Delhi. It would be adjusted against the registration fee of Rs 500/-. Participants would pay only Rs. 450/- at the time of registration.

General:

- i. The participants are advised to proceed only after **receiving the confirmation** from the institute. **No substitute** would be permitted to attend the programme without prior permission.
- ii. The nomination(s) for participation should be sent in the prescribed proforma.
- iii. The outstation participants may report **one day** before starting the programme.
- iv. The participants are required to **attend the programme for its entire duration**. The participants reporting late or leaving the course before its conclusion will not be entitled for TA and certificate.
- v. The Institute will have no responsibility whatsoever towards boarding and lodging in respect of family members, relatives or friends of the participants.
- vi. **Hostel accommodation** will be available to the participants for the duration of the programme and **one day before and one day after the programme**.
- vii. The institute will not be able to take the responsibility of making travel reservation of the participants.
